You know, if Microsoft liked the United States and did not want to get it bombed, you'd think they would report this to the government.

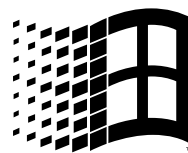
>>"Uh, yeah, FBI? Kim Jong Un called us and he's having trouble with Windows 8."
